Farmville, VA – On Tuesday March 14, 2023, Cumberland County officials and special guests celebrated the completion of the Randolph Volunteer Fire Station renovation and expansion project. The Randolph Volunteer Fire Station, located at 2145 Cumberland Road, primarily serves the southern and central portions of Cumberland County.



The renovation and expansion project successfully expanded the current station by over 3,000 square feet and included the addition of an ambulance bay, sleeping quarters, a day room, administrative space, as well as doubling existing community room space to 2,100 square feet. The increased space will allow for expanded community events and fundraisers for the volunteer fire department while enhancing the voting experiences for residents in Districts 4 and 5.

The primary focus of the project was the provision of additional EMS coverage furthering the County's mission of enhancing public safety for its residents. "The Randolph Fire Station renovation and expansion project will serve the residents of Cumberland County for many years to come and clearly shows the Board of Supervisors' ongoing commitment to public safety and collaboration with organizations that give of their time, skills, and money to serve our residents," said Board Chairman Brian Stanley.

The project, funded through the use of ARPA funds, was completed 6 weeks early and under budget. Staff, with the support of the Board of Supervisors, managed the design and project management process, saving the County over \$350,000 on the total cost of the renovation and expansion. The renovation and expansion is expected to be in full operation by April 1, 2023.
